Teens Plus: CrossFit Sundays





It also allows him to participate in the classroom by personalizing it to include his classmates, favorite foods, games or toys.

At Casa Guitar music is a big part of our lives so thanks to Pandora we are privy to an amazing variety of music which results in pretty sweet dance

moves. Another thing we enjoy doing as a family is "Movie night". This may seem simple, but in our house it usually involves blowing up air mattresses, hunting for every pillow and blanket in the house to build a throne on which to sit and eat popcorn. Sometimes it's hard to focus on the movie because our offspring #2 is at the age of asking 1,000 questions a minute.

Updates on Legislation

As a Partner in Policymaking graduate, I was able to attend Developmental Disability Day in Tallahassee on February 18, 2016. Now that the 2016 legislation is done, I would like to give the updates on what Senate and House Bills were passed. *They are as follows:*

SB 0936 - Relating to Persons with Disabilities

SB 230C1- Missing Persons with Special Needs

HB 7053 - Relating to Child Care and Development Block Grant Program

SB 0202 - Relating to Florida Association of Centers for Independent Living

HB 1083 - Relating to Agency for Persons with Disabilities

SB 0628 - Relating to Fees for Records

HB 7029 - Relating to School Choice

Also, I was chosen to sit on a Self-Advocacy/Leadership Task Force committee with the FDDC. I attended a very informative meeting in Orlando on March 31, 2016 and the information below was obtained at this meeting.

Some highlights of what was in the budget that passed:

Help Me Grow Florida - \$2.45 million dollars

The House and Senate agreed on over \$14 million dollars in state funds to draw down \$22 million dollars in federal Medicaid matching funds to transition over 1300 individuals off the iBudget waitlist! This means that if you are on the Medwaiver wait list, you are closer to receiving services for your child.

\$500,000 for employment assistance for individuals on the iBudget waitlist!

APD Provider Rate increases with Federal Match:

ADP Adult Training 1:3 for Min Wage Compliance \$1,759,833 GR - \$2,753,717 Match

ADP Adult Day Training 1:3 3% across the Board Increase \$974,583 GR - \$1,524,989 Match

ADP Personal Supports 3% across the Board Increase - \$2,710,303 GR-\$4,240.974 Match

ADP Residential Habilitation 3%across-the-Board Increase- \$4,242,289 GR- \$6.638.165 Match
